

Women and HIV 2018

Globally: 2016 Data 1.2

- 36.7 million people are living with HIV.
- 52% (18 million) are women and girls living with HIV and it is the leading cause of death for women of reproductive age.
 - 3 in 10 people living with HIV are unaware of their status
 - 1.8 million new HIV diagnosis in 2016, 5,000 a day
 - Youth 15-24 are a third of new HIV diagnosis
 - Many people globally do not have access to care or HIV treatment, and there is still no cure.

United States: 2015 Data^{3,4}

- More than 1.1 million people are living with HIV.
- 287,400 are women; this is 24% of the HIV+ population.
- 1 in every 7 people (15%) do not know they are living with HIV.
- 52 % of people living with HIV are not receiving regular HIV health care.
- 49 % are virally suppressed, a measure of successful HIV treatment
- Someone acquires HIV every 14 minutes.
- People of color, specifically women of color and trans women are disproportionally impacted by HIV. African American women account for 60% and Latinas were 17% of all women living with HIV.

Teens⁵

• In 2015, 55% of new diagnosis were in people under 35, 22% were 13-24

Women in Colorado 2015^{6.7}

- 2.7 million women in Colorado, 14% live below the Federal Poverty level, 13% do not have health insurance
- 427 New HIV diagnosis, 50 were women and 8 were concurrently diagnosis with AIDS.
- 13,690 people living with HIV, 1722 are women
- 6,146 people living with HIV died, 448 were women

Colorado, "IF I WERE HIV+... I'D STILL BE ME" Campaign in partnership with BCAP⁹ In 2018 women living with HIV and our allies will be wearing our pink shirts representing the estimated 1722 women (of the 13,690) living with HIV in Colorado. Of these women:

1 of the 10 will not know their HIV status

4 of the 10 will not be receiving HIV specific care

4 of the 10 have not achieved viral suppression

6 of the 10 have experience violence and trauma in their lives

10 out of 10 still deserve love and respect

Stigma and Discrimination ⁸ according to survey respondents

- 41% of Americans know someone who is living with HIV or has died of an AIDS related illness.
- 18% are uncomfortable working with someone who is living with HIV, 29% would be uncomfortable having their kids taught by a teacher living with HIV, 36% would not be comfortable having a roommate living with HIV and 45% would be uncomfortable having their food prepared by someone HIV living with HIV.
- One third of Americans believe one of these misconceptions about transmission: you can be infected from sharing a glass (25%), touching a toilet seat (16%) or swimming in a pool with some who is positive (12%).
