





- Social connection has proven essential to retention in care and improved health outcomes.





About PUMCares


- Funded through ViiV Positive Action for Women Grant
- Premiered in 2017
- Interactive video series consisting of 8 videos and accompanying resources
- Videos were released as virtual coffee-table discussions

But Why Did We Do This?



Concept of PUMCares

- Reduce isolation in women living with HIV.
 - Newly diagnosed
 - Living in rural areas with limited contact with other women living with HIV
- Before policy and advocacy-community.
 - Real-life stories from women living with HIV.
 - Promote sisterhood & togetherness



Process

- Communications Department →
 Communications Actions Team →
 Members with relevant experience
 - Healthy Relationships; Disclosure; U=U;
 Being Trans w/HIV; Mental Health &
 Wellness; Dating; Advocating for Self; and Motherhood
- Hired a videographer and editor for interviews.
- Released the videos with tie-in days
 - Virtual coffee-table discussions in 90 minute sessions.
 - Q&A and open discussion with stars from videos.

- Offering real-life connections with women living and thriving with HIV in their areas





PUMCares Sister Circle Outcomes

Short-term:

- Reduced isolation
- Increased social connection

Long-term:

- Increased self-confidence
- Reduced internalized stigma
- Increased comfort with disclosure and self-advocacy
- Some will even become advocates!



- Use the videos and resources in support groups, meetings, events (e.g., for awareness days, testing days, etc.), or individual/group counseling
- Collect feedback and contact info (will be kept confidential) for women interested in meeting other women living with HIV in their area and/or getting involved with PWN
- PWN staff will connect these women with others in their area, invite them to online and in-person activities to engage them in our **community** and eventually take the first steps into advocacy when they are ready
- Optional follow-up virtual discussion with providers/facilitators to share feedback, lessons learned, best practices, etc.





- Resource sharing
- Collaboration among providers and support group facilitators nationwide
 chance to share lessons learned and best practices
- Opportunities for women living with HIV to engage in community-building and introductions to advocacy in person and online with no need for public disclosure

- Self-love regardless of relationship status
